- 3. CONCLUSION: The project continued to perform as per the planned activities. Following are the important observations
- There is a continuous increase in the no. of referrals from the hospitals but still we need to extend our reach to the broader areas. It may be extremely helpful if we initiate a pilot project in coordination with the available health facilities and dispensaries in the 2 identified locations
- The synchronous efforts of our multidisciplinary team bore results when 3 of our children's started taking steps on their own (Abhimanyu, Yuval and Prince)
- Abhimanyu has also been inducted in the regular stream. Though we realize that to make an impact and aided with the RTE Bill, working with regular Government schools simultaneously would be more effective.
- An interactive seminar to educate parents about PWD act and guardianship was organized at KWS campus. We still aim to intensify our efforts to sensitize and educate the society.
- We also conducted a session at Haryana Institute for personnel and Administration, Gurgaon on Mainstreaming children with disabilities- Challenges and ways for Class II and III officials that primarily consisted of School headmasters and Principals
