REPORT ON THREE DAYS TRAINING REPORT ON CHILD FRIENDLY TEACHING METHODOLOGY

10th to 12th APRIL 2009

Venue: Baperbari, Santragachi, Howrah,

No of Participants: 12 (few of them coaching teachers, few are the teachers of drop out children and few are preparing the children for school.)

Training Objective:

The aim of the training programme is to build the capacity on teaching methodologies of class I-II (specially Eng, Bengali and Math), developing low cost teaching materials and develop leadership quality among the teachers of Swayambhar NARI.

DAY I

The training was started with introduction.

Session I: Socio- Economic situation of the marginalized section of society

A Marble Exercise was conducted with the participants. The participants have been divided into three groups according to their choice and the trainer has introduced the following concept through a structured exercise with 60 marbles and three strikers.

Discussions on the three tires socio-economic structure of the society and its impact on the children of marginalized section of the society. Sensitize the teachers to be sympathetic towards the children of their own centre. Lunch Break

Session II: Traditional teaching methodology and Activity based teaching methodology:

The participants have been introduced the following concepts through match sticks exercise and cloth posters.

To understand the limitation and the major problems of traditional teaching methodologies.

To realize the need of active teaching methodologies for the children of their centers.

- 12 Participants were given the cards with heading of different teaching methodologies and all the teaching methods were discussed with examples. Following are the thirteen types of activity based teaching methodologies.
 - 1. Reading
 - 2. Question answer

- 3. Writing
- 4. Group discussion
- 5. Action song
- 6. Game
- 7. Picture / poster
- 8. Role play / puppet
- 9. Practical demo
- 10. Educational visit
- 11. Picture / object
- 12. Project
- 13. Model display

Session III: Teaching Methodology of Bengali

The following concepts on teaching methodologies of Bengali were introduced through demonstration method.

Recognition, Reading and Writings of Bengali Letters: Through Barna Game Introducing sentence making, reading, writing without using *Swarachinha* through Teaching Learning Materials (TLMs)

Introducing *Swarachinha*, sentence making, reading, writing through Teaching Learning Materials (TLMs)

Introducing teaching methodology of Bengali prose and poetry through Story telling, Puppet show, Action Rhyme and group work.

Session IV: TLM making and Preparation for Practical class on second day of the training.

The participants were divided into four groups and four topics were assigned for preparing TLMs and practical class with the children.

DAY II

Day II was started with recapitulation of previous activities.

Session I: Practical Class

As suggested by the trainer, the local teachers have conducted home visit and have brought twenty students with different academic background. The teachers of four groups have conducted classes on Bengali letters, *Swarachinha*, Prose and Poetry with lots of TLMs and activities which they learnt previous day.

On the basis of their performance in practical class, suggestions and feedback were given to each of the teacher to improve their teaching skill, classroom management, quality of TLM, cooperation between teachers, teacher student relationship, board work, teaching attitude, etc.

Lunch Break

Session II: Teaching Methodology of English

The following methods were introduced through different teaching methodologies.

Introduced teaching methodology of English Alphabets through ABC song.

Introduced Teaching methodology of Rhyme through action

Introduced Capital and small letter through activity

Introduced concept of vowel and consonant and use of a/an through exercise.

Session III: Teaching Methodology of Mathematics

The following concepts have been introduced by demonstration of different teaching methodologies.

Concept of numbers

Concept of Place value and face value

Concept of Simple addition (horizontally and vertically)

Concept of simple subtraction (horizontally and vertically)

Session IV: TLM development on English and Mathematics

The participants have been divided into two groups for developing Teaching learning Materials on English and Mathematics.

DAYIII

Day III was started with report reading. All participants enrich the report with their feedback.

Session I : Mock Teaching Session

The participants were divided into four groups and were asked to conduct mock teaching session in-front of the all other participants. Two topics on Mathematics and Two topics on English were assigned to demonstrate.

On the basis of their performance in practical class, suggestions and feedback were given to each of the teacher to improve their teaching skill, classroom management, quality of TLM, cooperation between teachers, teacher student relationship, board work, teaching attitude, etc.

Lunch Break

Session II: Cooperation and Leadership

The following learning have been consolidated after conducting broken square exercise.

The objective and the activity should be clear to all members of a team

All the members of a group have different capacity and skill

Cooperation from all will ensure the goal of the team work

All members and their participation are equally important

All members have to contribute and receive cooperation from each other to achieve the goal of the team.

Session III Feedback

The participants shared their feelings and learning from the training programme.
