Survey report & Children Status:

HOWRAH

During the month of February 2006, a survey was conducted to identify the families and Children. There was discussion with the parents several times to motivate them in sending their children to the school. Most of the children are non-school going and few of them are dropouts. After the survey Howrah Centre admitted 25 Children. Among them 10 Children are girls and 15 Children are boys.

BHANGAR

During the month of February' 06 our this centre also conducted a survey to identify the families and children. There was discussion with the parents several times to motivate them in sending their children to the school. Most of the children are non-school going and few of them are drop-outs. After the survey the Bhangar Centre also admitted 25 Children. Among them 19 are boys and 6 are girls.

PANDITIYA

During the month of February' 06 this centre also conducted a survey to identify the families and children. There was discussion with the parents several times to motivate them in sending their children to the school. Most of the children are non-school going and few of them are drop-outs. In this school majority of the children are drop-outs. After the survey the Pandititya Centre also admitted 25 children. Among them 12 are girls and 13 are boys.

Training of the Teachers

There was a training of teachers for three days from 24th to 26th April' 06 at Howrah Centre. International method of teaching (Bridge Course) was imparted to the teachers to help to improve their capabilities. The technique of leading the students from known to unknown things taught with the help of Logo & Logography method. The training was imparted by CINI ASHA.

Daily Centre Activities

During the month of March' 06 the students were taught the Alphabets (Swarabarna) and numericals 1 to 10 which were repeated continuously for their learning and make them able to write properly.

In addition the students were taught to draw pictures of Ball, Birds, Flowers etc. This has made them very happy.

In April' 06 the Alphabet writing continued and entire Swarabarna was taught. Those who are fast learners have been taught the beginning letters of 'Byanjanbarna' and numericals 1 to 14. The slow learners continued Swarabarna and numericals 1 to 10.
